Dear friends.

We are extremely grateful for the Lord's goodness to us and for His wise and sovereign providence which enabled me to be tested, diagnosed and put into the hands of practitioners competent to handle my pericarditis condition.

Moving on to the news of the work here, we have begun another Discovering Christianity Bible Study and 8 non-Christians have committed themselves to coming. We have about 14 people around our table to have a light supper and then begin to study the gospel of Luke together. Two of these 8 people have started attending a church as a result of hearing the gospel from a Christian friend. The rest are unchurched folks. They are men and women, from university age to late 50's. Please pray for them over the next few months as they encounter the gospel and hear Christ's call to follow Him.

Last May or June a new couple began to attend our services. The man had just retired from a career as a Pentecostal pastor. During the last years of this ministry he had become increasingly uncomfortable with things he was hearing and seeing in his denomination. So much so that he decided to leave as soon as he retired. Over the last several months, he has sat under Reformed teaching and read Reformed books like A.W. Pink's "The Sovereignty of God" and Charles Spurgeon's "Sermons on Sovereignty". About a month ago one of his longtime friends told us that what he was hearing and reading had become a total earthquake in his life. I could tell the Lord was at work in a powerful way through my conversations with him. He began sending messages about what he was learning to a close friend from his old denomination with whom he had worked closely and who is now pastoring in a Muslim country. And now he has found someone leaving for a trip to that country and has sent some of the Reformed literature that has helped him to this pastor. He is also working on a French translation of William Payne's little brochure on the 5 Points: "Pastor, What's the Difference?" We are rejoicing in the Lord's work in the lives of this couple. They are very lovable people and are having a positive impact on the church.

Thank you, dear friends, for working together with us through your prayers that our Lord Jesus Christ might be known, loved and served in the French-speaking world.



We cannot, even by our best works, merit pardon of sin or eternal life from the hand of God, for those works are out of all proportion to the glory to come.¹Moreover, because of the infinite distance that is between us and God, our works can neither benefit God nor satisfy the debt of our former sins. When we have done all, we can, we have only done our duty, and are still unprofitable servants.² Besides, if our works are good, they originate from the Spirit,³ and whatever we do is defiled and mixed with so much weakness and imperfection that it cannot endure the severity of God's judgment.⁴

MEMORY LANE: A REVELATION 22

28th Jan – 3rd Feb:- Revelation 22:21 The Last Amen

This rather standard blessing concludes the book of Revelation in the typical format as the letters written in ancient Roman times, in particular epistles by religious leaders.

The final section (22:6-21), concludes the book, in fact concludes later in history, the canon of Scripture.

It offers final testimonies from God, the Lamb, the Spirit, the bride and the prophets who speak to the Bride for the Spirit. John, with the concluding "Amen" underlines emphatically the message of the rest of God's revelation in His Word.
