## LIG NETWORK/LIG-HAWE Assessment and Therapy Centre

More than 100 people in Danville received blankets, food and other essential items during a LIG outreach. Our Bible Clubs in the Hill – a very poor community in Danville where poverty and drug abuse are major challenges – were also held with great success. In addition, four parents and two children received free health services. They were deeply grateful for the practical help made possible by Lighawe. An important part of the week was the ministry to 126 elderly people, who were provided with hot, tasty food on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Unfortunately, no solution has yet been found for an alternative kitchen site. With the closure of the current service centre on September 29, a new facility will be urgently needed to continue this valuable ministry.

#### BAPTIST CONFESSION OF FAITH OF 1689 Chapter 1 Paragraph 8

### THE HOLY SCRIPTURES

The Old Testament in Hebrew (the national language of the people of God of ancient Israel)¹ and the New Testament in Greek (the common language of that time) were inspired directly by God, and were kept pure throughout the ages by his particular care and providence. They are therefore authentic,² so that in all religious controversies the church must appeal to them as final.³ But these original languages are not known to all the people of God, who have a right to and an interest in the Scriptures, and who are commanded in the fear of God to read and search them.⁴ They are therefore to be translated into the common language of every nation to which they come,⁵ so that (with the Word of God living richly in all) people may worship God in an acceptable manner, and through patience and comfort of the Scriptures may have hope.⁶

#### **MEMORY LANE**

## TRUSTING GOD AND RESTING IN HIS WORD 5<sup>th</sup>- 11<sup>th</sup> October: Psalm 56:3

"When I am afraid, I put my trust in You."

Notice that the verse says "when", not "if." Fear, in its various forms, besets us every day.

And notice what Ps 56:3 does not say:

- When I am afraid, I will panic/ fall to pieces.
- When afraid, I will grow depressed and give up.
- When I am afraid, I will run and hide.

When we as Christians are *afraid*, we *trust in God*, in His Providence, His Promises, in His Power, in His Protection and in His Peace.

Faith is being confident that God's positives are greater than our negatives.
